

6 Must Attend Intensive Care Meetings in 2017



1. ISICEM

The International Symposium on Intensive Care and Emergency Medicine (ISICEM) is a highly esteemed event in the intensive care medicine arena, which has become one of the largest congresses in this field.

The 2017 meeting, which will mark its 37th year, will be held **21-24 March** in the Square - Brussels Meeting Center in Belgium. It is open to all health professionals with an interest in intensive care and emergency medicine, including physicians, nurses and management.

Around 6,000 participants from across the world attend <u>ISICEM</u> each year to garner a range of benefits.
