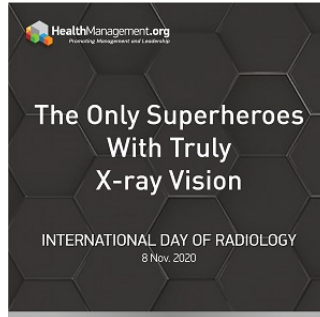


#IDoR2020: Dedicated to Imaging Professionals Fighting COVID-19
